

GENERAL INFORMATION

Camping/Over Night Arrangements: There will be camping available and cabins for rent at Wilson State Park and Corps of Engineers Parks. These arrangements are on your own. For more information call 785-658-2465.

Directions: (Follow "Scout" Signs as available)

Take exit 206 at Wilson and head north on Highway 232 for 6 miles until you reach the Wilson State Park entrance sign, turn west heading towards lake, follow for approx. 1 & 1/2

miles to the Hell Creek Entrance. Once in the Hell Creek Area follow the "Scout" signs to the Hell Creek Area Boat Ramp.

Permitted Areas: Fishing will be permitted anywhere around the lake. Please stay in your boat unless you are coming to the ramp for lunch, using the restroom, boat problems, and any extenuating circumstances. Please do not fish within 50 feet of other boats. Be courteous when traveling.

Food: A free breakfast will be served from 5am-7am for all participants. A free lunch will be served from 11am-3:30pm for all participants. Hamburgers, Hot Dogs, Fish, and a variety of other food will be available. For non-participants wanting to eat either meal, the cost is \$7 per meal. Non-participants are encouraged to eat with us and pay the \$7 for the food. All the additional proceeds will go to support outreach programs for the Boy Scouts of America.

Sportsmanship: Each contestant is expected to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety, and resource conservation. All participants must wear a lifejacket while the boat engine is running. All participants 16 years old and older must have a State of Kansas Fishing License.

Insurance: All boats shall have at least liability insurance according to B.A.S.S regulations.

Safety: All tournament contestants must observe safe boating and fishing practices. Each contestant is required to wear a Coast Guard approved, chest-type PFD while the combustion engine is running. No drugs or alcohol.

Boy Scout Fishing Benefit: The purpose of this event is a fundraiser to support the youth in the Boy Scouts of America.

SHORE & BOAT(General)

Entry Forms and Fees: Completed entry forms and fees for fishing derby to be received by Thursday, September 30th, 2010 will be \$20 per adult (18 and older). Youth under 18 years old can fish for just \$10. Entry fee on day of the event will be \$25 for adults and \$15 for youth 18 and under. Make checks payable to the Boy Scouts of America.

Tournament Concept: All fish caught and recorded are based on your "Scout's Honor" if no one is around to verify the length of the fish. This is an amateur, low-competition event opened up to any family or community member wanting to try to win some terrific prizes. Participants are fishing to win prizes, but also to support the Boy Scouts of America and getting youth outdoors in Northwest and North Central Kansas. All species can be sought. The Shore and Boat (General) divisions are separate when considering results.

Recording Fish: When checking in, participants will be given a "Fish-Log" to write down the species of fish and total length of the fish. Record fish length to nearest length. This is the form that participants will track their fish caught on as opposed to having a weigh-in of other method. This "Fish-Log" is what must be turned in by 4pm to the check-in area in order to see how well participants did relative to others in their age group. Again, if a tournament official is nearby they may verify length of fish, but if not it is on your "Scouts' Honor".

Permitted Methods: Any hook method with live or fake bait. Please do not use trot lines or nets.

Check-in: Check-in before the event begins will be between 8am - 9am at the Boat Ramp. This is where participants are given their official "Fish-Logs". Participants for the shore/boat divisions can show up, however, at any time during the day to begin fishing, they must check-in first through to receive the "Fish-log". "Fish-log" must be turned back in by 4pm to be counted.

Prizes and Awards: Prizes and awards will be awarded at the Hell Creek Area Boat Ramp Picnic Area starting at 4:30 pm. Please be sure to turn in your fish caught log by 4:00 pm to be counted. Prizes and awards will be given by the age groups. Awards will be given by number of fish caught and total inches caught. Inches of fish will be rounded to nearest inch. Prizes for each age division include, gift cards, outdoors equipment, and other prizes.

BASS DIVISION

Tournament Concept: Only Largemouth, Smallmouth, and Spotted Bass will be weighed. Five Fish Limit Tournament. Wilson Lake regulations state that there is a 15-inch length limit on all Black Bass brought in. No short fish will be weighed and any short fish brought in will result in a 1 pound penalty. Each team weighing-in a bag will also be asked to select one bass of their choice to be weighed for big bass.

Ties will be broken by largest fish in your bag and then by number of fish in bag. NO DEAD FISH will be weighed. Also, largest bass will determine winner of the Big Bass Side Pot. You must have registered and paid the \$25 side pot fee in order to be eligible. All entries are subject to be accepted or denied by the tournament committee. Fish will be weighed in provided official weigh-in bags only.

Entry Forms and Fees: Completed entry forms and fees for fishing derby to be received in the Council office by Thursday, September 30th, 2010. \$125 per boat (2-man teams & individuals welcome). Fee on day of the event will be \$150 per team or individual. *Optional* Big Bass Side pot registration of an additional \$25 per boat will be paid to the biggest bass. Winner takes all.

Check-in procedures: 5am-7am at ramp. Please check-in on the morning of the tournament at the check-in area on the Boat Ramp Point. You will be given a small paddle with your boat take off number and we will know that you have arrived. Then, a tournament official will check your live well and issue you a "live well check card" that must be brought to weigh with your boat paddle after the event.

On-Time Returning: Boat must be inside of the no-wake zone in the boat ramp cove by 3pm! Late Penalty, 1 pound per minute, 15 minutes late, lose all fish.

Permitted Methods: Any artificial lure, including prepared pork trailers. No trolling.

Prizes and Awards: 70% of all entry fees will be paid back in cash: Example based on 15 boats - \$125 x 15 = \$1875 (1 in 8 to be paid). 70% of 1875 = \$1312.50. 1st Place (60% of \$1312.50) - 787.50. 2nd Place - \$525 (40% of 1312.50). Big Bass Side Pot 100% Paid Back @ \$25 x 15 boats = \$375 1st Place - \$375. Winner takes all.

Other Awards/Give-A-Ways: Prizes, gift cards, and other items will be given away or drawn for during check-in and during the awards periods. Based on 15 boats, trophies will be given to the 1st and 2nd place winners (based on 15 boats).

Take-Off: Safe Light or approx. 7:00am. Take-off will be determined by order of registration. After submitting forms and fees, teams will receive a confirmation letter/email/phone call with their number for take-off, i.e. first form received will result in a 1st position take-off. If you do not receive a confirmation letter/email/phone call within 48 hours please contact me to make sure that your registration was received. On day of event, boats will wait in the boat ramp cove until their boat number is called by a tournament official.

Boat Requirements: Any boat 14 feet or longer and meeting BIA requirements will be permitted in the tournament. Also, each boat must be equipped with an aerated live well large enough to keep your fish alive and be in proper working order.

Other Notes: All applications for entry, determination of winners, and rights to cash, awards and prizes are subject to the approval of tournament officials. All decisions are final. Any protests must be in writing 15 minutes after the tournament ends.
